Old Business:



Creating a USAF "Bird Dog" From a Parkzone Micro J3 Cub

Well, it didn't take long before the walls of Tinicum gym decided to reach out and touch my new micro J3 cub. Although it only sustained a broken prop-shaft; most of you know the routine..... cut the



decals, cut your fingers, crack open the fuse and curse, get some coffee, curse a little more and then replace the stupid shaft with one you don't have.

I took my revenge and frustration out on the little J3 by deciding to do a make-over into a fire breathing USAF "bird dog" we used to harass the VC with, back in the not so good old days.



Step one called for a light sanding to rough up the paint and persuade the last remnants of old sticky decals to take a hike! While at it, I decided to trash the J3 engines and fill in the

holes with Micro-balloons, aka "Hobbylite filler" from Hobbico.

Now prepped, it was time to start laying on a base coat of paint over the now absent decals and a little more fine sanding. A trip to ACE hardware found a rack of small "Benjamin Moore" decorator paints jars, which are foamsafe and available in every color imaginable. The paint is rather thick and needed thinning a bit with water to work with my airbrush. FYI, the paint covers extremely well and dries faster than I can crash! Great paint for foam.

No "bird dog" would be complete without a few 2.75 air-toground missiles. As you can see from the pics; a length of balsa 3/16 stock, chucked in a drill and spun against a grinding wheel did a great job of shaping the warhead. I

then decide to drill through the shafts solely for weight reduction. Two each of the rocket were then CA'd to a piece of 3mm foam shaped to the air foil and glued to each wing.
